




Percentage Reporting That Someone in Family Plans to Help 9th Grader Pay for Postsecondary Education, by Race




Percentage Reporting That Someone in Family Plans to Help 9th Grader Pay for Postsecondary Education, by Parents' Income




Percentage of Families That Have Not Yet Begun to Prepare Financially for Child's Education After High School, by Race




Percentage of Families That Have Not Yet Begun to Prepare Financially for Child's Education After High School, by Parents' Income




Percentage of Families Who Have Opened an Account Devoted to College Costs, by Race




Percentage of Families Who Have Opened an Account Devoted to College Costs, by Parents' Income

Summary of Findings

Will Help to Pay

 White, black, and higher-income families are more likely to say someone in the family will help the 9th grader pay for their postsecondary costs.

Haven't Prepared

• Black, Hispanic, and lower-income families are more likely to have not started financially preparing to pay by 9th grade.

Summary of Findings


Open Account

• White, Asian, and higher-income families are more likely to do so.

Set Aside Money

White, Asian, and higher-income parents are more likely to save \$10,000 or more. Black, Hispanic and lower-income parents are more likely to save \$5,000 or less.
