

Collaboration in San Antonio

- Movement spearheaded by Mayor Julian Castro leading to cafécollege.
- Supported by Lumina Foundation's Latino Student Success Project.
- Strengthened by Excelencia in Education and other momentum builders.



Student Aid San Antonio

- Collaborative effort for FAFSA completion.
- Built on successful financial aid efforts of local school districts and colleges/universities.
- Offers free guidance and one-on-one assistance.



Financial Aid Council of San Antonio

Founded to provide infrastructure for collective work:

- Provide services and advocacy to facilitate college enrollment, persistence, and completion.
- Forum for communication and collaboration on student financial aid issues and initiatives.
- Supports best practices leading to systemic change.

Financial Aid Curriculum

Challenge: State law requiring HSs to teach how to pay for college beyond expertise of school districts.

- Financial aid experts provided technical knowledge through:
 - Creation of financial aid curriculum.
 - Professional development.
- School districts realize financial aid essential to college enrollment:
 - Adoption of FAFSA completion as key strategy in college and career readiness.

- Strategies to guide financial aid efforts.




Partnership Development

- Key Factor: Mutually beneficial to partners




Mutually Reinforcing Activities
